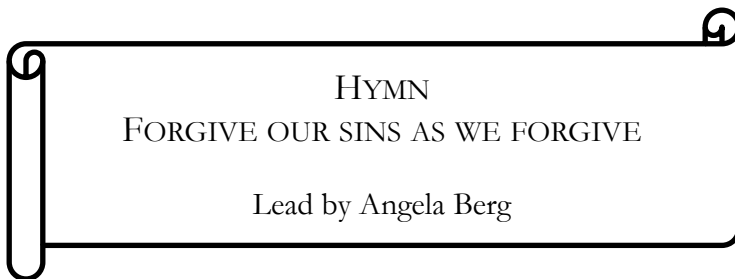
Our mission is to restore all people to unity with God and each other, in Christ. (BCP 855)

ORDER OF WORSHIP

THE OPENING SENTENCE

Officiant: If we live, we live to the Lord and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then whether we live or die, we are the Lords. (Romans 14:12)



CONFESSION OF SIN & ABSOLUTION

Officiant: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

All: **Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.**

Officiant: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

THE INVITATORY AND PSALTER

Officiant: Lord, open our lips.

People: **And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.**

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Officiant: Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness:

People: **Come let us adore our God.**

Psalm 103:1-13 *Benedic, anima mea*

- 1 Bless the Lord, O my soul, * and all that is within me, bless God's holy name.
- 2 Bless the Lord, O my soul, * and forget not all the benefits of the Lord.
- 3 The Lord forgives all your sins * and heals all your infirmities;
- 4 redeeming your life from the grave * and crowning you with mercy and loving-kindness;
- 5 satisfying you with good things, * and renewing your youth like an eagle's.
- 6 The Lord executes righteousness * and judgement for all who are oppressed.
- 7 O Lord, you made your ways known to Moses * and your works to the children of Israel.
- 8 You are full of compassion and mercy, * slow to anger and of great kindness.
- 9 You will not always accuse us, * nor will you keep your anger for ever.
- 10 You have not dealt with us according to our sins, * nor rewarded us according to our wickedness.
- 11 For as the heavens are high above the earth, * so is your mercy great upon those who fear you.
- 12 As far as the east is from the west, * so far have you removed our sins from us.
- 13 As parents care for their children, * so do you, O Lord, care for those who fear you.

A READING FROM THE EPISTLE TO THE ROMANS 14:1-12

Reader: Ryan Fannon

Welcome those who are weak in faith, but not for the purpose of quarreling over opinions. Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables. Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat; for God has welcomed them. Who are you to pass judgment on servants of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike. Let all be fully convinced in their own minds. Those who observe the day, observe it in honor of the Lord. Also those who eat, eat in honor of the Lord, since they give thanks to God; while those who abstain, abstain in honor of the Lord and give thanks to God.

We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

Why do you pass judgment on your brother or sister? Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God. For it is written, "As I live; says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall give praise to God.

So each of us will be accountable to God.

A READING FROM THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW 18:21-35

Reader: The Rev. Deacon Lynn Werdal

Then Peter came and said to him, “Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?” Jesus said to him, “Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.

For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, ‘Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything. And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, ‘Pay what you owe. Then his fellow slave fell down and pleaded with him, ‘Have patience with me, and I will pay you.’ But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt.

When his fellow slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, ‘You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?’ And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he would pay his entire debt.

So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart.”

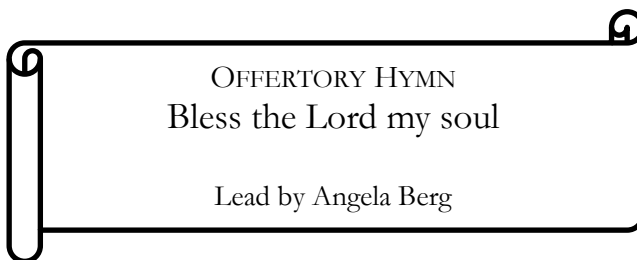
