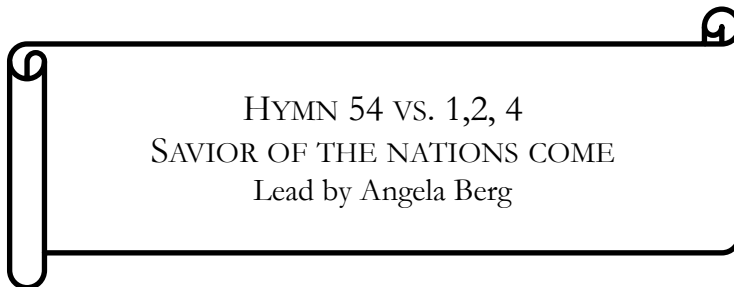
MORNING PRAYER: RITE TWO 9:30AM
